Created with Singapore in Mind

Singapore is one of the world's greenest and most livable cities. Yet, Nouvel is surprised to find that Singapore's wealth of greenery is seldom fused or considered in the local architecture. With the Le Nouvel Ardmore, Nouvel achieves a bold statement to integrate natural greenery into the overall architectural concept right at the start, to fuse functionality with nature together with all the wealth of its elemental aesthetics. By doing so, he exploits the full context of a garden city and infuses the energy of Singapore's greenery into his architecture.

Bungalows in the Sky

Nouvel further challenges the conventions of residential apartment living, and introduces the concept of an elevated bungalow; each, with its own orientation, affords the same sense of privacy and exclusiveness up in the air as would a bungalow on the ground. Living in their spacious homes, residents will enjoy greenery and natural elements of air, wind, light and engendered views. In the Observatoire on the 26th and 27th floors, they will delight in the breathtaking views of the surrounding cityscape and an unobstructed city skyline.

Architecture with Personality

Jean Nouvel has often cited the advice given to Diego Velázquez by his teacher, "The painting should extend beyond the frame." Nouvel says, "This has marked me for life. It is one of my absolutely permanent desires."

Inspired by the Rubik's cube, Nouvel presents an opportunity to provoke confrontations of orientations, textures, lights and unlikely techniques, such that the Le Nouvel Ardmore maximizes the views and quality of its modular internal spaces.

Movable façades play on transparencies and light, using the façade grid and automated screens to create a symphony of infinite variations throughout the day.

Playing on different levels of views, transparency, and how this building is used by its residents, the façade will reflect the residents' lives within, varying with each day of the year, and every hour of the day. This allows residents the luxury of framing their specific views and control the flow of natural light into their living spaces, creating their own spatial ambience and quality.

In response to Nouvel's sophisticated design, award-winning French lighting designer Hervé Descottes of L'Observatoire illuminates the Le Nouvel Ardmore with a contemplative radiance that allows for internal reflection. The same pensive luminescence in turn communicates how individuals, within their private spaces, within the building, come together to comprise a harmonious whole.

This aesthetic urban paradigm is carried through the interiors of the showsuite with elegantly detailed spaces designed by Koichiro Ikebuchi of Atelier Ikebuchi, winner of Singapore President Design Award 2009.

Ikebuchi comments, "The Le Nouvel Ardmore is very pure architecture, it's pure grid and pure white. Yet its built-in spaces are quite complex and they provide, at another level, lavishness in the use of space. For the showsuite, I aimed at creating spaces to satisfy a luxury lifestyle while keeping to the core of Nouvel's original design intent."

Architecture is a Gift

Of architecture, Jean Nouvel says, "When we build, it's for someone. Architecture is a gift." The Le Nouvel Ardmore is architecture that generates joy, architecture which celebrates life. For this development, the Pritzker Prize laureate has adapted what he has understood of homes in Singapore and their essence. Nouvel designs beautifully spacious and elegant residences with thoughtful facilities to readily offer every comfort that residents need to enjoy themselves in Singapore's tropical climate. It is architecture created with the environment in mind, and with the resident at the heart of it all.
